*Note: The order in which the test steps are listed reflects the sequence of the certification criterion and does not necessarily prescribe the order in which the test should take place.*

### Required Tests

**(d)(5)(i) Automatically Stop User Access** - Automatically stop user access to health information after a predetermined period of inactivity.

Standard(s): None

Criteria ¶	System Under Test	Test Lab Verification
(i)	The user sets/records the period of inactivity after which, a user cannot access the session.	The tester verifies that a user cannot gain further access to the electronic session after the period of inactivity expires.

**(ii) Require User Authentication** - Require user authentication in order to resume or regain the access that was stopped.

Standard(s): None

Criteria ¶	System Under Test	Test Lab Verification
(ii)	A user is forced to authenticate their credentials before regaining access.	The tester verifies that a user must re-enter credentials in order to access health information within the Health IT Module after the access has been stopped.
