

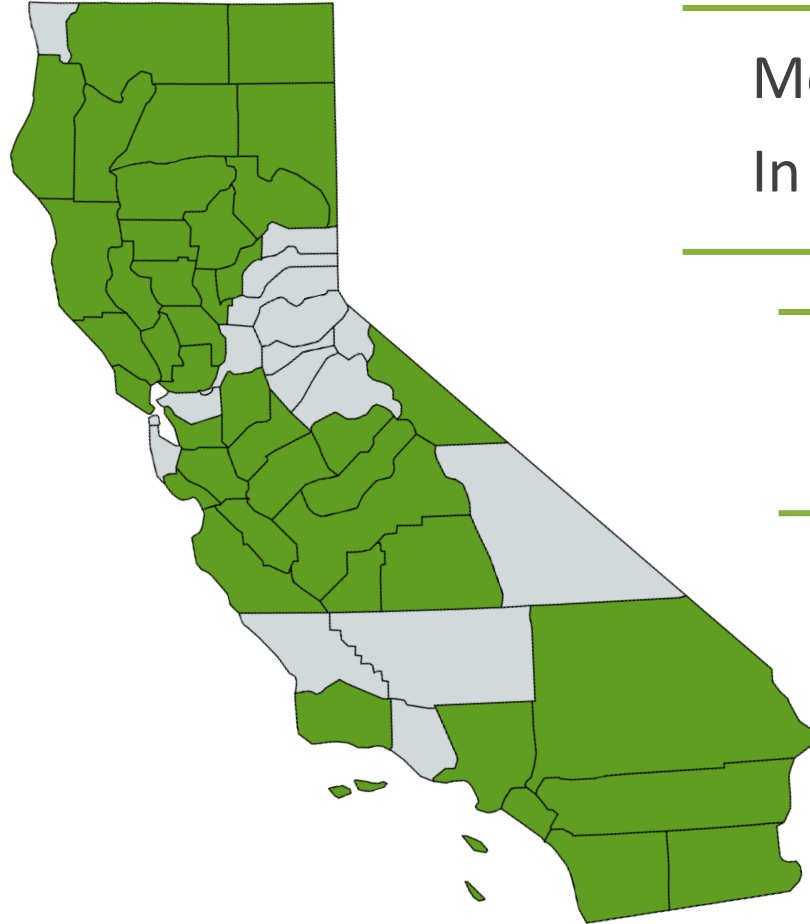

What is CTEN?

California Trusted Exchange Network

Purpose

Voluntary self-governance of statewide health information exchange among HIOs, health systems, state agencies

Features

- Technically lightweight
- Enabling rather than prescriptive
- Transport and content agnostic

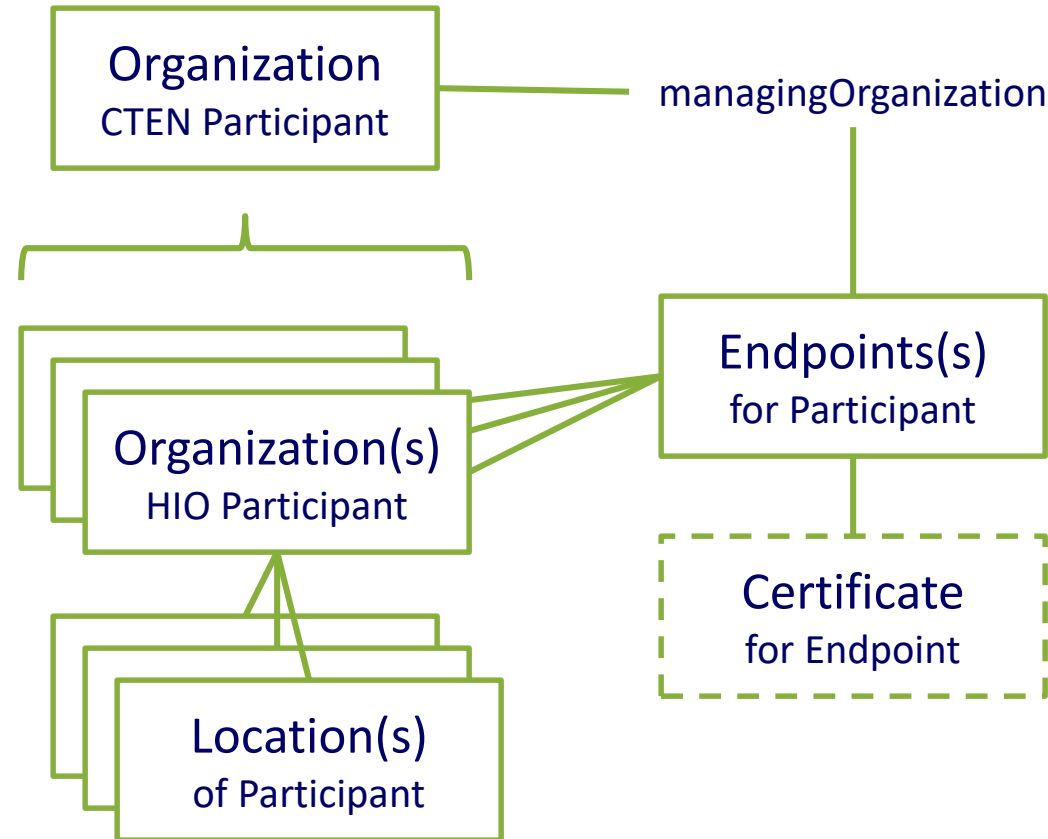
Problem...

 - A directory of their participating organizations

an open FHIR API

How does the Service Registry work?

1. Access the open directory via FHIR API (automated) or portal (manual)
2. Identify organizations with which you wish to exchange (hopefully all)
3. Retrieve endpoint information (profile, content, URL, certificate public key)
4. Configure your endpoint



Problem...

- How do you efficiently access health information in time of widespread emergency or disaster?



What is PULSE?

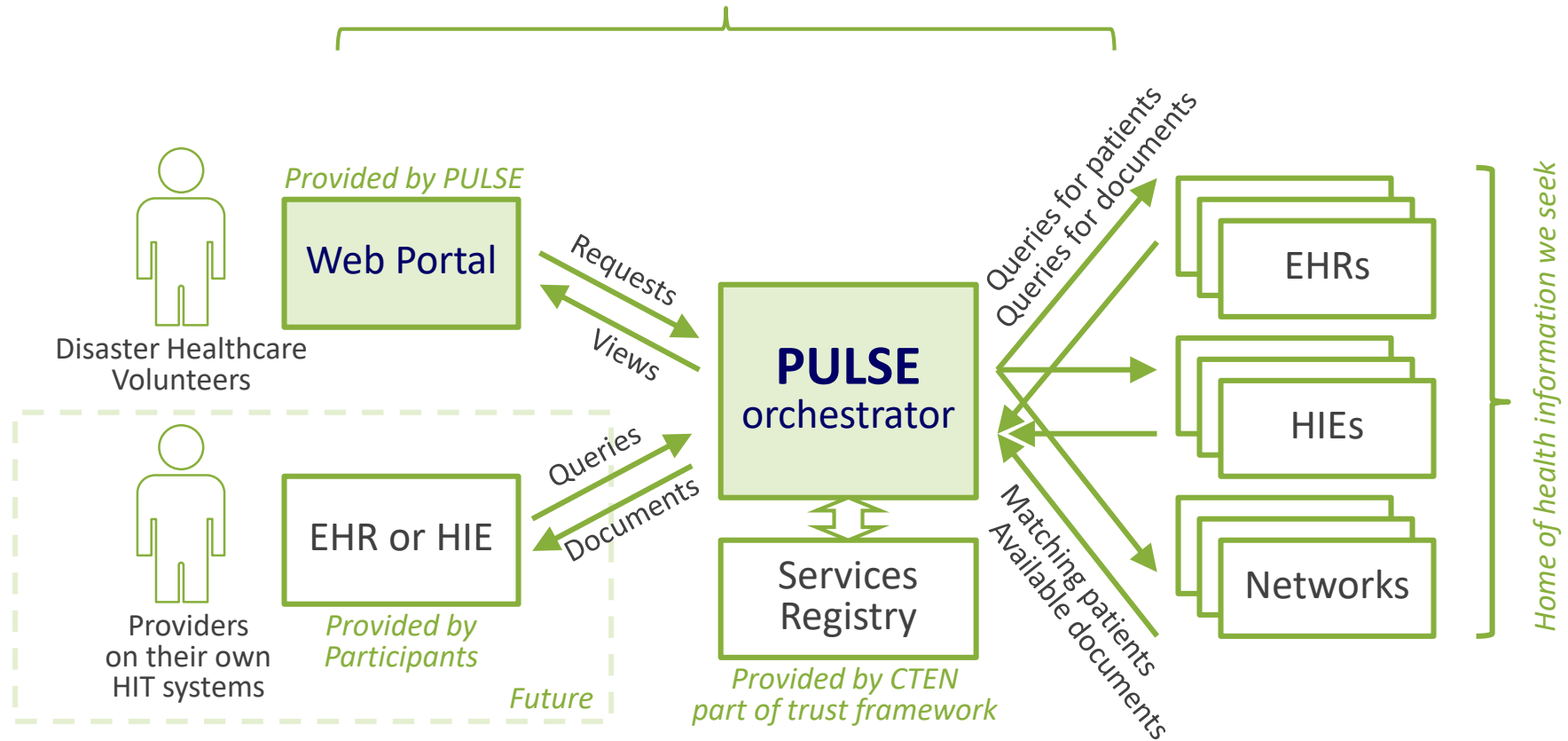
- Provides disaster healthcare volunteers with access to electronic health information for victims and evacuees during time of large-scale emergency
- Information that may be drawn from disparate systems within and outside of the effected region

What is ESAR-VHP?

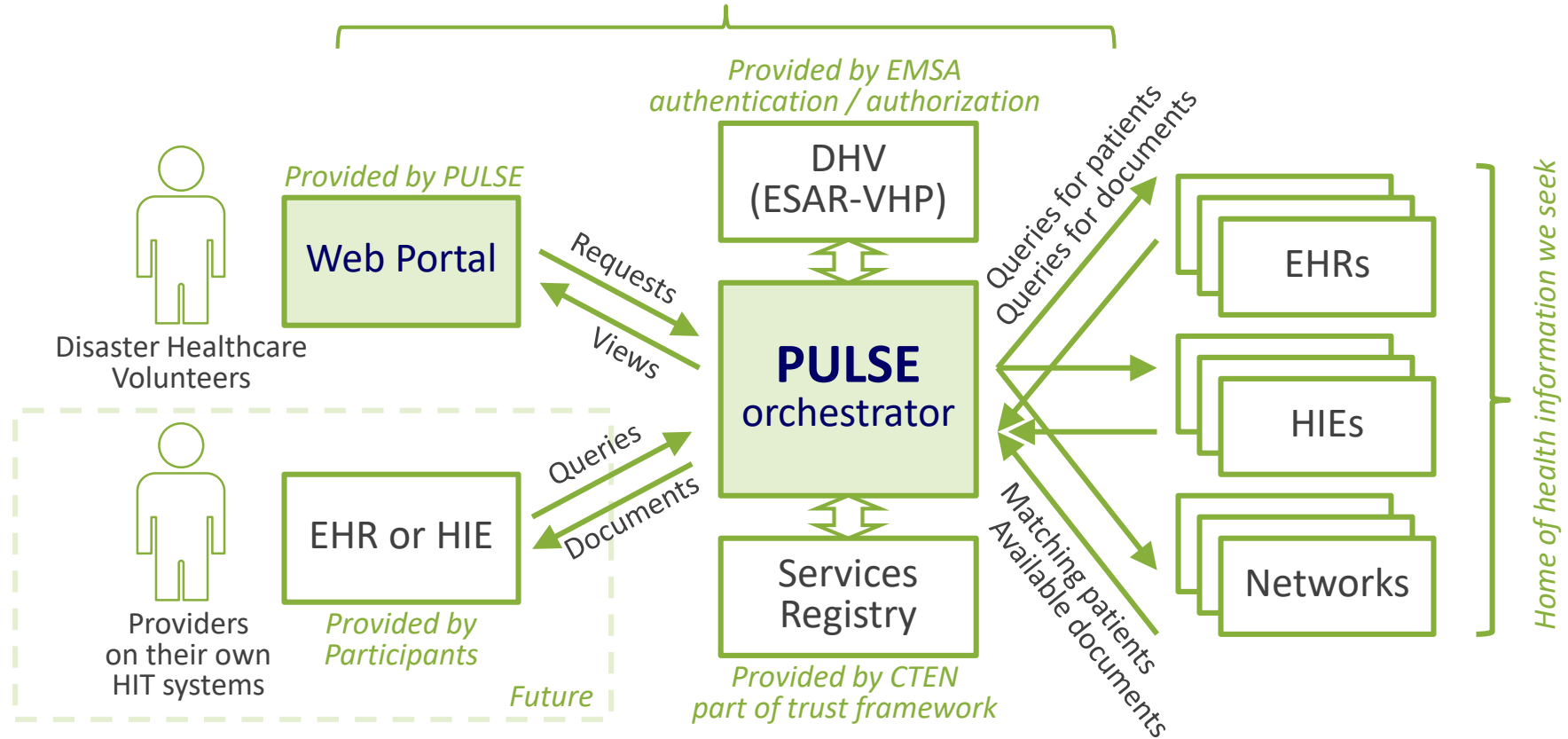
Emergency System for Advance Registration of Volunteer Health Professionals

- State system for registering volunteers in advance of disasters, public health / medical emergencies
- Verifies identification, credentials, licenses, certifications, and hospital privileges...
 - ...of health professionals...
 - ...who volunteer to provide health services during a public health emergency

Housed within California EMS Authority as Disaster Healthcare Volunteers or DHV

How does PULSE use it all?

Directories
as the basis
of trust

- DHV (ESAR-VHP) to provide authentication for authorized, licensed, and verified healthcare volunteers using the portal
- Service Registry to provide listing and information on authorized and verified participating HIOs and health systems
- PULSE Orchestrator to distribute queries and collect results for users and systems
