



## <u>Proposed Goal 1:</u> Consistent and expanded implementation of FHIR medication resources necessary for med list functionality.

- 6/2017 Obtain HL7 guidance to support consistent implementation and use of FHIR medication resources (MedicationStatement, MedicationOrder\*) by vendors.
- 12/2017 vendors have outlined a clear plan to implement the MedicationDispense FHIR resource in support of medication history data and have identified partner organizations for testing exchange of dispense and claims data.

<u>Goal 4 (For ONC/HHS)</u>: Promote med list effort as a model for public-private collaboration and ensure effort participants are implementing standards to support broad federal interoperability initiatives.
