


Meeting Etiquette

Med List – Goals Recap (For Usability Work Stream)

- By June 30th, Med List participants should be able to demonstrate expanded connectivity and enhanced usability App features for consumers and patients, and allow individuals' the ability to share medication lists with providers and others.
 - » Additional providers deploying FHIR-enabled systems
 - » Improved patient-facing workflow and app features
 - » Provider-facing workflow for viewing shared medication lists

Annotation & Feedback - Goal

 Allow for an interactive med list, so that the patient may add/provide feedback.



Recap of Annotation & Feedback Discussion

Adherence

- Patient medication adherence is a complicated topic
 - » Available research indicates that reminders and patient feedback have an impact
- Provider review of Med List to ensure Patient is compliant
- Many prescriptions are written but not filled by patients:
 - » Contributing factors:
 - Cost
 - Proximity to pharmacy
 - Patient intent to comply
 - Patient perspective: is the medicine necessary or helpful for their condition
- Displaying information in a certain way to improve adherence is supported by randomized controlled trials (NIH)



Annotation & Feedback Literature Review Summary - For App Developers consideration

Themes

Access

 Increased patient access and online engagement has the potential to improve the data quality in EHRs

Workflow

- Role of patient feedback in improving the accuracy of medical records
- Patient's role in annotating and correcting their EHR medication list
 - » Typically at the beginning of a visit

Presentation

- Pairing medication with visual cues. This reference refers to both layout/format and annotation/feedback.
- Presenting medication in a way that is intuitive to patients, and that aligns with current research in human factors engineering





Communication & Sharing



Communication and Sharing - Goal

 Allow for communication between users including the patient, primary care provider, pharmacist, and all other providers (i.e. specialists) to aid in the medication reconciliation process.

Communications Recommendations Summary From Phase 1

Feedback from Patient Perspective Roundtable (11/15/2016):

- Using language that's understandable by the patient/caregiver
- Interactive med list that can incorporate feedback from provider
- Med list should enable communication between patient, PCP, pharmacist and well as specialists with respect to the reconciliation process
- Remove barriers for access by caregivers
- Should include contact information for whom to discuss medications with

Todays Discussion: Communication and Sharing - Literature review summary

Themes

- Allow communication between users to aid in the medication reconciliation process:
 - » Patient
 - » Primary care provider
 - » Pharmacist
 - » Other providers (i.e. specialists)
- Remove barriers to allow caregiver access to the medication lists.
- Privacy Issue:
 - » Allow patient ability to provide permissions for access to providers and caregivers
 - » Ease the process and allow for more transparency across the healthcare continuum
- Educate physicians on the use of the med lists and the importance of incorporating the medication information into the patient's health records.
